## REPRESENTATIVE DIANA DEGETTE, 1ST DISTRICT, VISITS VILLAGE

On January 30th, Representative Diana DeGette met with Mayor Tisdale, Councilmembers Klasina VanderWerf and Katy Brown, Police Chief Michelle Tovrea and City Manager John Patterson, to discuss items of interest to the City and Council. Among the topics discussed were: school safety, gun violence, justice administration grant funding, infrastructure repair and maintenance, protection of municipal bond funding, immigration, the federal protection of local revenue sales tax sources, Amendment 64 (marijuana), and the continued funding of science and industry in the form of research technology grants.

This is the first CHV meeting with Representative DeGette since CHV was moved into her district 10 years ago, and she hopes there will be many more.

## NEW FACILITY OFFICIALLY OPENS JANUARY 12TH

On the cold morning of January 12th, the City and South Metro Fire Rescue Authority held the ribbon cutting to officially open the new facility. The ribbon cutting was followed by the presentation of the colors while bagpipers played, and then there was the traditional ringing of the bells and opening remarks by both Mayor Tisdale and officials from South Metro Fire Rescue.
